

Coalition Opposition to Proposition 131

We oppose the ballot measure to require jungle primary and ranked choice voting general elections. It goes too far, it's overly complicated, expensive and leads to more money and backroom deals in politics.

We are a coalition of organizations that want less dark money in politics. We support election reform that is done thoughtfully to ensure no voter, especially those of historically underrepresented communities, do not get disenfranchised.

The proposed ballot initiative would make confusing and hasty changes to our voting system. The proponents promise to solve partisan divisions in Colorado's elections, but RCV has resulted in voter confusion, decreases in voter participation and manipulation of the primary results in other states.

We oppose the efforts of the millionaires and billionaires behind this measure who only want to control elections with money. This model only tilts CO elections toward moneyed-interests by ensuring the candidate with the most money wins.

County clerks, who run our elections statewide, were never consulted about the proposed changes and have raised red flags about whether it can be implemented correctly with the available resources and in the tight time frame. We heed the warnings of our state's election administrators.
